


"CHECK YOUR TRAINS BEFORE YOU TRAVEL OVER FESTIVE PERIOD" WARNS LOCAL RAIL USER GROUP

Special timetables and engineering work will affect Barking – Gospel Oak rail line from this Sunday

Rail passengers were warned to check their train service over the Christmas and New Year period for alterations and engineering work by the Barking – Gospel Oak Rail User Group (BGORUG).
